REMINDER: STRUCTURED ACADEMIC CONTROVERSY PROCEDURES

1. You will be given a statement, a side (pro or con), and a group
2. Research arguments for your side. **SHARE YOUR NOTES WITH ME!**
3. On the day of, the pro side of each group will present its three arguments.
 - a. The Con side is responsible for taking notes on the pro side. They may **ONLY** ask clarifying questions (no counter-arguments).
 - b. The group may only move on once the Con side is able to paraphrase the arguments of the Pro side back to them to the satisfaction of both Pro members.
4. Perform the same task (with pro and con swapping roles).
5. As a group of four individuals, your final task is to come to a consensus on your view of the issue in light of the arguments you have explored.
 - a. You do not need to stick to or defend your original side (or either side at all)
 - b. If you cannot come to a consensus, carefully outline the remaining points of disagreement
 - c. Whatever conclusion you come to, take notes on your discussion to share with Isaac
